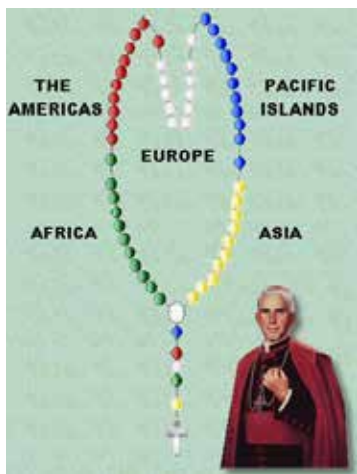

The Propagation of the Faith



This weekend is a special collection for The Society for the Propagation of the Faith (SPOF), founded in Lyons, France, in 1822. This society is charged with gathering offerings from Catholics worldwide to support missions everywhere. The Propagation of the Faith seeks prayer and support for pastoral and evangelizing programs of mission dioceses from high school and college students and adults. This includes aid for the education and support of seminarians, religious novices and lay catechists; for the work of Religious Communities in education, health care and social services; for communication and transportation needs and for disaster and emergency relief, when necessary.

World Mission Rosary: In February of 1951, Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen (national director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith from 1950 to 1966), in a radio address (The Catholic Hour), inaugurated a World Mission Rosary. "We must pray, and not for ourselves, but for the world. To this end, I have designed the World Mission Rosary." Praying this Rosary, Archbishop Sheen said, would "aid the Holy Father and his Society for the Propagation of the Faith by supplying him with practical support, as well as prayers, for the poor mission territories of the world."

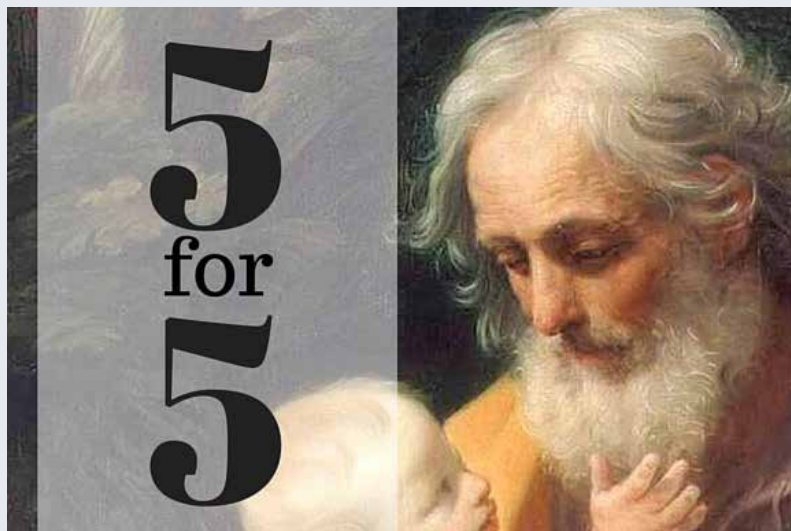

Stand Against Violence week is **this week**. In 1994, the U.S. Catholic Bishops issued a pastoral letter entitled "Confronting a Culture of Violence: A Catholic Framework for Action." As a response to the pastoral letter, parishes and dioceses across the United States are called to focus on peacemaking and policy efforts against violence from January 15, the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and January 22, the anniversary of the tragic Roe v. Overcome Indifference and Win Peace

Every day, we hear of issues such as war, poverty, or persecution that affect our brothers and sisters around the world. The problems can seem so large, complex, and remote that they can leave us paralyzed, overwhelmed, or even numb. We may wonder, "What can I possibly do?"

In his Message for the 49th World Day of Peace, celebrated on Jan. 1, 2016, Pope Francis urges us to overcome such challenges by replacing isolation with community, and indifference with solidarity.

How do you get started? PRAY!

The Prayer to Overcome Indifference:

All too often, Lord, we turn away from the world's many problems, which seem too big, too complex, or too far away. Forgive us our indifference. It is easier, Lord, to see only what is around us: our lives, our homes, our challenges.

Forgive us our isolation. Help us to see with your eyes which notice one another and help us understand. Help us to dream your dream of communities that reach out and dialogue and where diverse people creatively cooperate. Help us to be people of solidarity and action, so moved by prayer, encounter, and understanding that peace can become a reality. Amen.



THE JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

Our three gifts

Like the Magi offered Baby Jesus gold, frankincense and myrrh, we faithful are to offer three gifts to the Lord, says Pope Francis.

During his homily at the Mass for the Solemnity of the Epiphany in St. Peter's Basilica, the Pope said that we are just as called to follow the light of Jesus today, to worship Him with all our heart, and present Him with our gifts of freedom, understanding and love.

The Pope began recalling the words of the Prophet Isaiah addressed to Jerusalem, but which, he noted, are also meant for us. When Isaiah says, "Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you," it also invites us to rise and go forth, leave behind all that keeps us self-enclosed, go out from ourselves and recognize the splendour of the light which illumines our lives.

Francis pointed out that this "light" is the glory of the Lord, for the Church "cannot illude herself into thinking that she shines with her own light." Pope Francis invited those gathered to follow the light which God offers, "the tiny light" of the Child, and once we have found Him, let us worship Him with all our heart, and present Him with our gifts: our freedom, understanding and love.

"True wisdom lies concealed in the face of this Child. It is here, in the simplicity of Bethlehem, that the life of the Church is summed up. For here is the wellspring of that light which draws to itself every individual in the world and guides the journey of the peoples along the path of peace."
