




"But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth..." JOHN 16:13

Did you know...

Trinity Sunday, officially called "The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity," is one of the few celebrations of the Christian Year that



commemorates a reality and doctrine rather than a person or event? On Trinity Sunday, Christians remember

and honor the eternal God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday is celebrated the Sunday after Pentecost, and lasts only one day, which is symbolic of the unity of the Trinity. Eastern Churches have no tradition of Trinity Sunday, arguing that they celebrate the Trinity every Sunday. Westerners also commemorate the Trinity at every Eucharist, although they set aside a special feast day for the purpose as well.

"Mercy overcomes every wall, every barrier, and leads you to always seek the face of the man, of the person. And it is mercy which changes the heart and the life, which can regenerate a person and allow him or her to integrate into society in a new way." ~ Pope Francis, Sept. 10, 2014

Admonish the Sinner: This work of mercy is highly misunderstood and many of us do not know how to "admonish" in a Christian context. "Admonish" may seem harsh or even self-righteous, but it can be understood as to offer advice, to urge, to reprove or to warn another. First of all, Jesus provides His own commentary: 'If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. Truly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

(Mathew 18:15-18).

It is important to note that Jesus explains that we should first seek out our "brother" in private. Too many of us skip to the public rebuke of our family and friends on Facebook and never seek them out individually. A person is much more likely to listen to a trusted friend or relative, rather than a street preacher holding a sign that says: "Repent! Sinners go to Hell!" While the message might be the same and true, it does not mean it will be effective. The question is not whether a billboard that says, "Hell is Real" is true (which it is); the question is, "what is the most effective method of 'admonishing the sinner' in the modern world?"

THE JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY



GENERAL AUDIENCE:

'How often do we need to be reminded of God's unchanging love and ready forgiveness, lest we lose heart when we ourselves



or our dear ones go astray!'

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

In our continuing catechesis for this Holy Year of Mercy, we now turn to Jesus' parable of the merciful father who welcomes back his prodigal son with unconditional love and forgiveness. Jesus wishes to teach us that we are children of God not because of any merits of our own but because of the infinite love of our heavenly Father. How often do we need to be reminded of God's unchanging love and ready forgiveness, lest we lose heart when we ourselves or our dear ones go astray! The parable speaks not only of the prodigal son, but also of his older brother, who must also learn to accept the father's mercy, which transcends both reward and punishment. By calling for a feast of thanksgiving, the father is really asking each son to share his joy by recognizing the other as a brother. The parable ends without our knowing how the older brother responds to this invitation. Jesus in effect is challenging each of us to think about how we respond to God's invitation, to open our hearts to his reconciling love and to become "merciful like the Father". www.zenit.org
