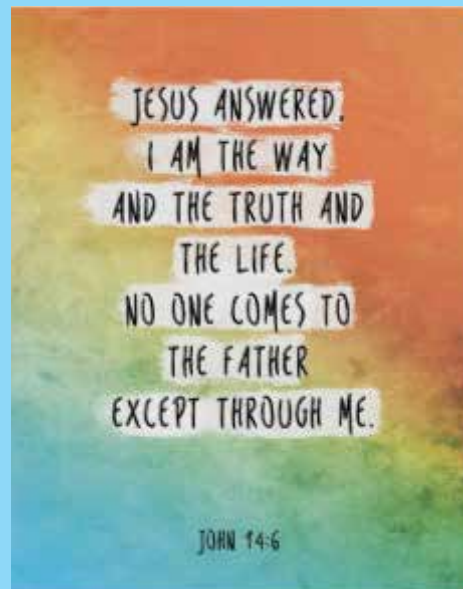

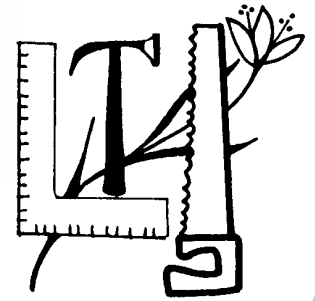

Did you know...

...St. Bartholomew, one of the original apostles, was from Cana in Galilee and was identified as Nathanael in the Gospel of John. After Jesus' Ascension which Bartholomew witnessed, he went on to evangelize in Ethiopia, Mesopotamia, Parthia and Lycaonia. Legend has it that he also was a missionary in India and Greater Armenia where he preached to and is credited with converting Polymius, King of Armenia, to Christianity. Polymius' brother, Astyages, consequently ordered Bartholomew's execution. Tradition holds that he was flayed alive and crucified head down. His feast day is August, 24.

Fees:

Registration fees are \$65 per student for registered St. Joseph parishoners with a maximum of \$130 per family. Non-parishoner fee is \$130 per student.

Cancellations:

If Jonathan Alder Schools are closed, PSR and all parish activities are also cancelled. Please see our Facebook page or parish website for current information.

Sacraments Policy:

Students in the year before and during a year of a Sacrament (1st/2nd and 7th/8th) must have a minimum 75% attendance record. If their attendance is >75%, a pastoral conference with Father Trapp is required. Students and parents must attend **ALL** required meetings and retreats to be eligible to receive the Sacraments.

Student Safety:

All parents with children in the 1st - 4th grades **MUST** escort their child/children into the building and all the way to their classrooms upon arrival. Parents are also required to return to the building to pick up their child/children *from their classroom*. Teachers will **NOT** release a child until a parent or guardian comes to the classroom door to pick them up. These rules are in place to assure your child's safety.

THE JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

General Audience: On Keeping Watch and Awaiting the Lord

“Jesus today reminds us that awaiting eternal blessedness does not free us from the commitment to make the world more just and more inhabitable”



Dear Brothers and Sisters, Good Morning!

In the passage of the Gospel for today (Luke 12:32-48), Jesus speaks to his disciples about the attitude they should have regarding the final encounter with him, and explains how the expectation of this encounter should push us toward a life full of good works. Among other things, he says, “Sell your belongings and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy” (v 33).

This is an invitation to give value to almsgiving as a work of mercy, to not place our confidence in fleeting things. To use things, without attachment and egotism, but rather according to the logic of God, the logic of attention to others, the logic of love. We can have many things, be very attached to money, have a lot. But after the end, we can't take it with us. Remember that the shroud doesn't have pockets.

Jesus today reminds us that awaiting eternal blessedness does not free us from the commitment to make the world more just and more inhabitable. In fact, precisely our hope of possessing the Kingdom in eternity drives us to work to improve the condition of our earthly life, especially that of our weakest brothers. May the Virgin Mary help us to be people and communities who are not limited to the present, or worse, nostalgic for the past, but rather, projected toward the future of God, toward the encounter with him, our life and our hope.
