RCIA - Rite of Acceptance




Our RCIA group: Brett, Carey, Dan, and John with their sponsors, families, & Father Trapp.


The position requires about 15 hours a week and salary is negotiable.

Why do we receive the Body and Blood of Christ?

What first comes to mind in answering this question are the words Jesus says at the Last Supper: "Do this in memory of me." At the Last Supper Jesus wanted his followers to remember the events that took place on Good Friday. He did this with bread and wine, which became His Body and Blood.

At the time of Holy Communion during the Mass, we take, eat, and receive the Body and Blood of Christ. And at each and every Mass, we remember Jesus' love for us by His dying on the cross. Through the receipt of Jesus' Body and Blood we offer our thankfulness to God the Father for Jesus' love for us.

The gift of Holy Communion - the Eucharist - is Jesus inviting us the share in His divine life, so that we may have eternal life with Him. In the Gospel of John, Jesus says of himself that he is: "Bread that has come down from heaven." And after Jesus fed the great crowd: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. "This is why we should desire to receive Jesus in Holy Communion and always go to Sunday Mass. Read and learn more in the YOU CAT # 99, 167, 208-212, 488, and 523.

Prayer of Pope Francis for the Jubilee Year of Mercy

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him.

Show us your face and we will be saved. Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief.

Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!"

You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified.

You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error: let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God.

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind.

We ask this of you, Lord Jesus, through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy; you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever.
