EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION:


Eucharistic Adoration is an act of worshiping God in the church as He is present in the consecrated Host. As the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, the faithful adore it.

Generally, adoration is an hour but can be any length of time you can manage. Afternoon hours have recently been added to a general schedule of 6 am - 10 am and 6 pm to 10 pm.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI said, *“Adoration is essentially an embrace with Jesus in which I say to Him: ‘I am yours and I ask you, please, always stay with me’.”*

CHILDREN’S LITURGY OF THE WORD:

Children’s Liturgy of the Word (CLW) is specifically designed to develop a child’s awareness and knowledge of Scripture on a level they can comprehend. With the help of the Holy Spirit and adult lay people, the younger children of our parish family, 4 to 7 years old, explore our loving Lord on the beginning of their faith journey.

SAINT MARTIN DE PORRES OUTREACH



The St. Martin de Porres Outreach Mission Center began in the 1990's by a group of parishioners who were interested in improving the lives of the poor and needy in our community.

It began as furniture and household items in our basements and garages. We operated by word-of-mouth and quickly grew.

In early 2000, we formalized our mission with the advice of Father Pat Toner. With a very generous grant from the Catholic Foundation we completed the St. Martin building in 2009.

We are very blessed to receive monetary donations from our 5th Sunday collections at St. Joseph, private gifts and of course our community. We also raise money from the dessert table during the Lenten Fish Fries.

With these funds we are able to have an inventory of small appliances and household items that are a critical need for those in our town. We put a special emphasis on

brand new beds for the children in need. It is part of our philosophy that every child deserves a clean, warm bed of their very own.

In addition to this mission we also coordinate the Giving Tree at Christmas that provides much needed daily house hold items for the DNA Center, Plain City Food Pantry and Holy Family Soup Kitchen downtown.

The Knights of Columbus Council at St. Joseph Parish is a thriving and dynamic group of over one hundred men and growing. Our organization is based on the principles of Charity, Unity and Fraternity first begun by Father Michael McGiveny in New Haven, Connecticut, in 1882.



We continue these principles by supporting various requests at St. Joseph and Plain City through prayer, monetary donations and service hours.

We offer our prayers for our seminarians at the Pontifical College Josephinum and offer monetary support for their educations as well; at St. Joseph we organize our Lenten Fish Fries - a perennial favorite; the Easter egg hunt for the kids, the Fourth of July fireworks viewing, and we "man" the grills for our Parish picnic in August.

For our community we organize a supply drive for our US Veterans at the VA Hospital in Chillicothe; we collect food for the Plain City Food Pantry; and we directly offer financial scholarships for students in our parish who are entering college. (And you may have seen our road sign along Rt. 42 in the New California area - we are litter patrol several times a year).

We are very proud to be honored as a *Star Council* for the past two years and will be eligible again this year. This award is given to councils who meet the Supreme Knights goals for outstanding achievement in membership, insurance and service programs.

We look forward to seeing you at our monthly meetings and social gatherings which are advertised in the weekly bulletin. All men, 18 and over are welcome.

St. Joseph's Youth Ministry helps teens better know, love, and serve God. Faith life doesn't stop after Confirmation. God calls each of us to a lifelong, authentic relationship with Him. PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION

The PSR program at St. Joseph has a great group of 34 dedicated volunteers to instruct the children of our parish in our faith. Some even have children in the parish school. We have a total of 160 students in the program from grades 1 - 8. Grades 1 - 6 meet on Mondays throughout the school year in two sessions at 4:30 pm and 6:30 pm. The junior high youth meet on Sunday mornings throughout the year at 9:40 am.

This year the **PSR Work of Mercy Project** is collecting coins on each first Monday of the month for The Holy Family Soup Kitchen. We have collected almost \$400 so far. The whole parish can participate if they would like. From each PSR session, the class with the most money wins a pizza party.
