We Are God's Instruments

There's a great story in the Old Testament about God and Moses (see *Exo. 4:2-4*). God "uses" Moses to show His presence and power.

In the book of Isaiah, God "uses" Cyrus, a *pagan King*, (see Isaiah 44-45) to free the Israelites. The point is, God uses *people* to achieve His plan!

In our day, God uses **us** (you and me) to achieve His plan! **We are God's instruments!** If we are *open* to God, we will hear God say (like He said to Moses) "What is that in your hand?" [*If we're at home* – maybe it's a little one, or the arm of an elderly parent; maybe it's a laundry basket, or a lawn mower; if we're **at work** - a tool, a document that affects others, article we make; if we're **at school** - a text, a laptop; or if we're **at the store** – a shopping cart or money]. In all these places, God is asking us, "Are you *serving* as my instrument? In what you're *doing*, or what you're *saying*, or what you're *using*, are you showing your love for me and for others.

These are moments of grace! These are moments when God reveals Himself to us, *in simple everyday situations*. God reveals **who we are** (creatures made in God's image); **what we are** (instruments of God's plan); and **why we are here** (we are here to be called back to God Himself)...

Maybe we don't think of ourselves as God's "instruments." Maybe for some of us, God and religion is an *external* thing, something we do on Sundays, or on special occasions like baptisms, weddings and funerals. Maybe we've *blocked God out* with our *pride*, or our *selfishness*, or our *indifference*, or our *fear*... Maybe we need to think about that...

Sooner or later, we come to realize that God *uses* our strong points *and* our weak points to *move us forward*, to achieve His plan. Sooner or later, we are *willing* and *eager* to be His instrument.

Today and every day, let us respond to God, "Yes, Lord, **make me your instrument.**"
