

Dear Parishioners of Saint Joseph Parish,

I hope that the season of Advent has led you to be filled with joy and expectation as you celebrate this Christmas! During Advent, we focused upon preparing to celebrate the birth of Christ. We are the people of God who look forward to Christ's return in His second coming, but now we remember when Christ first appeared. Jesus comes to us as a little child, sharing our human nature, our flesh in all things but sin. He was sent by the Father to announce to us the good news of salvation.

This Christmas celebrates the 800th anniversary of Saint Francis of Assisi's creation of the first Christmas Creche Nativity scene of Bethlehem. Saint Francis desired to re-create the simplicity and the humility of Christ's birth in a stable, placed into a feed box as an infant. He desired for us to be deeply taken in by the mystery of the incarnation, the Word becoming flesh, and Jesus dwelling among us. Our Father's love was revealed to the world through the gift of a child. As Saint Francis called him, the Babe of Bethlehem.

The nativity scenes in our church, parish activity center and in our homes come alive with the message of Christmas from the Gospels, that Jesus loves us, wants to share our humanity and to bring us the good news of salvation.

This celebration gives us the opportunity to reflect upon the importance of the life of Christ within our lives. The message of hope that Jesus comes to give to each and everyone of us. To realize our lives are no longer to be lived in darkness, but to be lived in the light of truth and grace.

In this bulletin, you will find the prayer of blessing for your nativity scene and your Christmas tree. Pray together as a family. This is now a great opportunity to reconnect with the importance of the Sunday Mass, to keep building upon receiving and praying on the Word of God and celebration of the Eucharist. Our celebration of the importance of Saint Francis' nativity scene is a great opportunity to help us to connect with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishop's program to revitalize our understanding of the mystery of the Eucharist. Now is a great opportunity to grow in our understanding of the presence of Jesus in our lives, His presence in the Eucharist, of Jesus' body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus. Christmas reminds us that Jesus was placed in a manger, an animal feed box in the city of Bethlehem, which means "city of bread." Jesus comes as this little child to be our bread from heaven. As a living bread from heaven, Jesus gives us the promise of eternal life, for all who receive His most sacred body and blood. Every Sunday, we are able to receive the gift of

the Eucharist, the gift of living bread from heaven. This is what helps us to keep our closeness with Christ, Jesus himself.

I am most grateful for everyone's help and assistance, and all that you do here at Saint Joseph Parish; all those who lector, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, our religious education teachers, choir members, all those who volunteer and serve and help in many different capacities, the work and support by the members of our Knights of Columbus council, the devotion of the women who gather to learn on the Word of God at Women's Walking for Purpose. I'm truly grateful for everyone's generosity of their time, talent and treasure to support the work of Saint Joseph Parish.

In the joy of this Christmas season, I pray for the abundance of God's blessings as the Babe of Bethlehem comes to bring us be with you and all of your family. I pray for the help in the intercession of Saint Joseph to watch over and protect us in the new year.

## SPIRITUAL LIFE

## **EUCHARISTIC ADORATION**

Eucharistic Adoration is an act of worshiping God in the church as He is present in the consecrated Host. As the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, the faithful adore it.



Generally, adoration is an hour but can be any length of time you can manage. Hours are Monday – Thursday 6 am to 11 am and 6 pm – 9 pm; and Fri 6 am to 8 am, 9 am to 11 am and 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm. As St. Clare of Assisi said, "Gaze upon Him, consider Him, contemplate Him, as you desire to imitate Him."

Not sure what to do at Adoration? First, pray as you can, whether that is reciting one Hail Mary or Our Father, or praying the Rosary. Your prayer is your own. No one elses. Pray for your family, say each by name as Jesus has called us each by name. Read the Psalms for guidance. Talk to Jesus and tell Him about your day; the struggles and joys. Thank Him for His love in your heart. And then, listen. Listen with your ears, mind and heart. Our Lord is always with us and He will be with you during Eucharistic Adoration. ## LITURGY

To enhance the living experience of our Lord at Mass, we need people to help us. Preparation for each Mass is essential and we have several groups of volunteers that bring joyful meaning to each celebration. Which one calls you?

SERVERS, LECTORS, USHERS & EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS – Pope Francis said, "Serving at the altar is a privileged way to draw closer to Jesus. The closer you are to the altar the more you will remember to speak with Jesus in daily prayer; the more you will be nourished by the word and the body of the Lord, the better able you will be to go out and help others..."

Contact Father Trapp or Deacon Tony if you are ready to share your enthusiasm for Mass by greeting our parish family, voicing the Holy Scriptures or by attentively serving at the altar of our Lord. Ushers are a perfect team effort for a husband and wife. Lectors can make all the difference in how we open our hearts to the Word. We are blessed with several that voice the readings so well. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will also be taking the Lord to the homebound. Servers are eligible to begin training in the 5th grade. Starting our week at our Lord's table sustains us. Be part of this blessing today.

## RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process an adult goes through in order to join the Catholic Church. RCIA is designed for anyone who wants to learn more about Catholicism and grow closer to God by learning about what the Catholic Church teaches. These classes are appropriate if you are discerning joining the Church, if you are curious about the Catholic faith, or even if you already are Catholic and would like to learn more about your faith. Sessions include instruction on the Catholic faith and occasional speakers on special topics. Please see Father Trapp to learn how you can begin this journey of faith. Classes resume on Thursday, January 11th at 7pm at the PAC.

## CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Children's Liturgy of the Word is designed to develop a child's awareness and knowledge of Scripture. With the help of the Holy Spirit, and two adult lay facilitators, children explore our loving Lord on their journey of faith. St. Joseph will have the Children's Liturgy every Sunday at the 11 am Mass during the school year. All children in attendance at the 11:00 Mass, ages 4 through 4th grade, are welcome to join the Children's Liturgy of the Word procession.

## SAINT MARTIN DE PORRES OUTREACH

The St. Martin de Porres Outreach Mission Center began in the 1990's by a group of parishioners who were interested in improving the lives of the poor and needy in our community. It began as furniture and household items in our basements and garages. We operated by word-of-mouth and guickly grew.

In early 2000, we formalized our mission with the advice of Father Pat Toner. With a very generous grant from the Catholic Foundation we completed the St. Martin building in 2009. We are very blessed to receive monetary donations from our 5th Sunday collections at St. Joseph, private gifts and of course our community. We also raise money from the dessert table during the Lenten Fish Frys. With these funds we are able to have an inventory of small appliances and household items that are a critical need for those in our town. We put a special emphasis on brand new beds for the children in need. It is part of our philosophy that every child deserves a clean, warm bed of their very own.

In addition to this mission we also coordinate the Giving Tree at Christmas that provides much needed daily house hold items for the DNA, Plain City Food Pantry, West Side Ministries, New Path Pregnancy Care Center and JOIN. ## THE FATHER EDWARD FITZGERALD KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCIL 12772

The Knights of Columbus Council at St. Joseph Parish is a thriving and dynamic group of over 100 men and growing. Our organization is based on the principles of Charity, Unity and Fraternity first begun by Father Michael McGiveny in New Haven, Connecticut, in 1882.

The Knights are deeply involved in promoting and growing our faith through works for the church such as supporting life, supporting the priesthood by financially supporting seminarians at the Pontifical College Josephinum, supporting incoming college students through a yearly scholarship program, and by being active in our church as part of the lay ministry. The Knights also organize the yearly Lenten Fish Frys, the Fourth of July viewing party, and are active each year for the parish picnic in September. Our outreach goes beyond the church as well, as we support the Plain City Food Pantry/DNA, Coats for Kids, Special Olympics, assisting our Veterans including a special November Memorial Mass, and the KAIROS prison ministry program. You may have seen our road signs on Rt. 42 in the New California area – we are litter patrol several times per year.

This season we will begin our fifth year of *Gifts For Life* program which follows the European custom of collecting baby items from December 26 through February 2 or the season of *Candlemas*.

We also participate in several fundraisers throughout the year: Cash Bonanza in the Spring, Football Fundcrazr in the Fall and sub sandwich sales. These fundraisers keep our charitable works functioning and thriving. The next sub sales are January 6–7 and February 10–11. Order forms will be in the bulletins.

We are always looking for Catholic men to step up and join our proud organization. We look forward to seeing you at our monthly meetings and social gatherings which are advertised in the church calendar. All men 18 and over are welcome. ## RELIGION EDUCATION

The Religious Education program at St. Joseph has a great group of more than 20 dedicated volunteers to instruct the children of our parish in our faith. Some even have children in the parish school. We have a total of 128 students from grades 1 – 8. Grades 1 – 6 meet on Mondays throughout the school year in two sessions at 4:30 pm and 6:30 pm. The junior high youth meet on Sunday mornings throughout the year at 9:40 am.

For our Corporal Works this school year, we will be working on specifically are Feed the hungry, Clothe the naked, and Visit the sick. We are asking our students to bring in items for the Shut-Ins, Elderly, and Prisoners. We are collecting things like small bottles of hand lotion, hand soap, shampoos, conditioners, bars of soap, adult hats, and gloves, and adult new socks and underwear. For our Works for the Spiritual life of our community, we are collecting bibles from the thrift stores to be distributed to prisoners by Father Trapp. We will be praying at the Rosary Garden every chance we get. Please stop by to pray with the students anytime. At each Mass we pray for the faithfully departed, so we do it every time we participate in a Mass.
