Weekly Bible Reflections

"They fell down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." (Matthew 2:11)



SCHOOL GROUPS ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND

The Feast of the Epiphany is deeply enriched by the prophetic words of Isaiah in the first reading. Isaiah speaks of a great light that will shine upon Jerusalem, a light that will attract nations and kings. This imagery of light and glory not only embodies the physical manifestation of God's presence but also symbolically represents the dawning of a new era. The passage foreshadows the coming of the Messiah, who will be a light to the nations. The gifts of gold and frankincense, mentioned in the prophecy, interestingly prefigure the gifts that the Magi will offer to Jesus. This connection between the prophecy and the event of the Epiphany bridges the Old Testament expectation with the New Testament fulfillment, indicating the universality of Jesus' mission. This reading sets the stage for understanding the significance of the Epiphany as not just a historical event but a divine appointment that fulfills ancient prophecies.

Reflection Questions for the Week

How does this prophecy deepen your understanding of the universal nature of Jesus' mission?
In what ways can you see the "light" that Isaiah speaks of in your own life?
How can you be a part of bringing this light to those around you?
