Weekly Bible Reflections

"Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed...He told them, 'Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." (Mark 1:35, 38)

In today's Gospel reading we see a perfect example of stewardship. Jesus gives His time to do all that God wishes - healing the sick and preaching. But before He begins, Jesus takes time to be alone with God in prayer. It is through prayer, spending time with God, that we are given the graces needed to do what He wishes us to do. Praying before acting is a great habit to develop.



Join us on Wednesday evenings from 6-8pm at the PAC for a soup supper and Lenten study, from February 21 through March 20.

Liturgy is an essential element of Scripture. It is central to the Bible's story - and not just the New Testament. The New Testament



liturgy, especially the Eucharist, was promised in the Old Testament. What was anticipated, prefigured, and foreshadowed before Christ, he fulfilled in his Sacred Passion. Discover God's plan as it is expressed through the Bible and the liturgy. This study wil unlock the meaning of covenant, as understood in the Bible, from Genesis through Revelation. Mark 1:29-39 reveals Jesus' deep commitment to prayer and solitude. In our busy lives, finding time for solitude and prayer can be challenging, yet it is essential for spiritual growth and discernment. We are reminded of the power and necessity of prayer in our Christian journey. It is in these moments of solitude that we can recharge, gain clarity, and align our actions with God's will. Jesus' example shows us that effective ministry and service are rooted in a solid foundation of prayer and relationship with God.

Reflection Questions for the Week

How can we better integrate moments of quiet reflection and prayer in our own busy lives? In what practical ways can we follow Jesus' example of reconnecting individuals to their communities and God, especially those who feel isolated or marginalized?

Reflect on a time when you felt spiritually restored or renewed. How did this experience change your perspective or actions?
